



## From The Rector

The connection between Easter and Baptism is important. In the Epistle to the Romans Paul wrote, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by

baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin." Very early in the Church the tradition began of baptizing new Christians during the night before Easter. Remember the new day began for them at sundown. When they went to the tomb on Easter morning, it was empty. Jesus rose during the night. So we are buried with him in baptism and rise with him during the night of *Easter Eve* into new life as the body of Christ, the Church.

At the beginning of Lent I asked the congregation to acknowledge, pray for, and support Jamie Heath as an adult

candidate for Holy Baptism. We will, God willing, baptize him at the Vigil. The idea behind our Wednesday Lenten program this year was to model an approach for preparing adult candidates for baptism through the witness of the community rather than teaching classes about doctrine. In other words, we want to incorporate new Christians into our mutual love of Christ and of each other. It is foundational to experience the faith. Then practice ministry. Then spend a lifetime learning about doctrine. The former Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams has written, "All Christian doctrine is directly or indirectly a reflection on Easter." We will also, God willing, baptize the Knickerbocker babies for the same reason. They are part of the congregation and will be ministers as they grow in grace and spend their lives learning and growing, never knowing what it would be like not to be a part of the household of God.

So when you see the font and touch the water, remember your baptism and pray for inspiration to lead your life as one who has been raised with Christ into new life. Remember also our responsibility to be kind and caring toward each other as Jesus instructed us when he said, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

See you Sunday if not before.

## Deacon's Word

I have always found Palm Sunday to be a paradoxical worship service in our faith/tradition. On the one hand, we enter the service waving palms announcing the presence of Jesus as he enters

Jerusalem, and twenty minutes later we are reading the passion of Christ and his death. We go from festive to somber, all in less than half of an hour.

I think that we are too quick to dismiss Palm Sunday and move to Good Friday. Marcus Borg, the renowned theologian who recently passed away, wrote *The Last Week* in 2006 based on Mark's gospel that offers what many theologians and historians believe is the real story of Holy Week.

Roughly two thousand years ago, Palm Sunday was the beginning of the week of Passover, the most sacred week of the Jewish year. Two processions entered Jerusalem that Sunday. From the east, Jesus approaches the city at the end of his journey from Galilee riding on a donkey, an animal symbolizing the

common people.

It is a prearranged procession, for Jesus tells two of the disciples where to go to get a young donkey for him to ride. As he rides into the city, there are those ahead of him" spreading their cloaks and palms on the road shouting Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord." (Mark 11:8-9).

Sometime on the same day to the west was a different procession, an imperial one demonstrating the power of Rome. It was standard practice for the Roman governor of Judea, in this case Pontius Pilate, to travel some sixty miles from his palace in Caesarea to Jerusalem for the major Jewish festivals. They came not out of respect for the Jewish subjects, but to be there with additional troops in case of trouble. After all, the Passover celebrated the Jewish people's liberation from an earlier empire.

So on this Palm Sunday we have the peasant procession entering the city from the east and from the west enters the royal procession with its might and power. What we know of Holy Week plays itself out against this backdrop. The same question, the same alternative, faces those who would be faithful to Jesus today. Which procession are we in? Which procession do we want to be in?

The February 23, 2015 Vestry meeting of Emmanuel Episcopal Church was called to order at 5:16 p.m. The original date of the meeting was February 16, but, was rescheduled due to snow.

Members present: Dan Bieger, Frank Goodpasture III, Fred Knickerbocker, Jeremy McLaughlin, Doug Mitchell, Greg Oakley, Denise Rowe, and Barbara Walling.

Members absent: Barbara Sue Kurre, Zane Myers, David Taverner, and Debbie Tidwell.

The meeting began in the Parish Library with a viewing of the training video for the new AED (automated external defibrillator). The AED will be mounted at the handicap elevator mid-level (just outside nave).

◆ **The January 2015 minutes were reviewed.**

◆ **Rector's Report**

- After action review of weather related issues the week of February 15, 2015
- If Fr. Joe is able to safely get to church, all functions will proceed as normally scheduled. However, the primary concern is the safety of parishioners and caution should always be exercised during inclement weather.
- Staff will work proactively to secure a contract with a snow removal service for any future snow related weather issues.
- Fr. Joe is now the Dean of the Abingdon Convocation.
- In conjunction with a weekly potluck dinner, Wednesdays in Lent will be a time for reflection and Fr. Joe will be guiding and counseling those who wish to be admitted as candidates for baptism or renewal of baptismal vows.
- The Easter Vigil will include the adult baptism of Jamie Heath.
- A medieval history class from King College will be here on Thursday, February 26 to tour the building and speak with Fr. Joe about the conical liturgy and church architecture.
- We've had an increase in college students at services on Sunday.
- Dan Bieger was welcomed as he comes to Vestry to complete Mike Blair's term.
- Fr. Joe will be out of the parish for continuing education at Duke University the first week of March. Canon Kathy will cover.
- The Adult Sunday School topic, Cathedrals, has been well attended.

- Ed and Becca Powers have volunteered as youth leaders. They will be contacting the parents of the youth in the parish.
- The Spaghetti Dinner has been rescheduled to Thursday, April 9. The proceeds raised will assist funding the fall trip to the National Acolyte Festival in October.
- The duties of Jr. Warden are overwhelming, therefore, a Buildings and Grounds Committee is being formed. Jeremy McLaughlin has spoken to Tom Rogers and Allen Rushing and they are willing to assist.
