Deacon's Word

Matthew 1: 20-33-An angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet. "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means "God is with us."

It is the Christmas season. No wait, it is Advent. Good. For I tend to associate the Christmas season with the secular world: Black Friday, stringing lights, seeing who is naughty or nice, making sure all are accounted for in our cards and gifts. Many of you may enjoy this part of the season, but it has never had much appeal to me. The advent season though tells the story of the greatest gift God gave to humanity, God's very presence among us. Emmanuel, God is with us. The stories we read this lectionary season are from Luke's gospel speaking to the coming of Christ, including my favorite canticle *Mary*'s *Song of Praise* or the *Magnificat* as many know it.

My favorite Christmas hymn is an advent hymn, *O Come O Come Emmanuel*. It is also my son's favorite seasonal hymn. He convinced his chorus teacher in elementary school to allow him to sing it at a Christmas chorale concert at the Flat Gap Missionary Baptist Church, an uncommon place for an advent song. The words are rich and deep and speak to the core of the hopes of the Jewish people.

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice, rejoice, Emmanuel shall come to thee O Israel.

My friend Willie Dodson played this first stanza on a banjo the other night and then added his own verses to the hymn:

O come, O come, O God divine, deliver captive Palestine, Author of all you set the pace of time, reconcile our bitter war-torn minds. Rejoice, rejoice, Oh God divine will come to you O Palestine.

O come, O come, O people of good will, and gather on top of the Zion hill Together we will work the dirt till, the olives grow and we get our bellies filled Rejoice, rejoice, O people of good will, will gather on top of the Zion hill.

When Christmas Eve come in all its pageantry and vitality here at Emmanuel we are ready for God to be with us. And not just with us as Christians, but with all people regardless of religion or ethnicity. May we embrace this incredible gift of love in our lives this season and pray and work to see God's love everywhere and always.
