Dr. Shannon Vance has joined the staff as Emmanuel's new Formation Minister. Shannon was born in Columbus, Ohio, where her father was a graduate student at The Ohio State University. He received a PH.D. in psychology and went on to a career in academia. When Shannon was twelve her father won a Fulbright Scholarship to study in

Egypt giving Shannon an opportunity to live there. She says this changed her entire outlook on life, particularly experiencing a culture with another religion. It was also there she saw extreme poverty for the first time.

Shannon graduated valedictorian from Happy Valley High School which is near Milligan College. She majored in World History at ETSU before going to Michigan State University to study West African History, earning both her Master of Arts and PH.D. degrees. Along the way she received fellowships to study in Africa.

She returned to this area to accept a faculty position at King College. The Buechner Institute introduced Shannon to

a range of Christian philosophers and writers.

When Dr. Dale Brown, who had directed the Institute from its inception, died tragically, Shannon assumed the duties of the Buechner Institute, continuing the work as the King Institute for Faith and Culture. Under her leadership the Institute brought a range of speakers including theologians, poets, memoirists, and historians. A number of these lectures have been at Emmanuel.

Shannon has regularly attended the Wednesday Eucharist at Emmanuel and participated in the Adult Catechesis Group. She was confirmed when the bishop was at Emmanuel in September.

Shannon is excited to join the staff at Emmanuel. Her vision is to help us grow our relationship with Christ in a more guided way, in order to deepen our faith and to live in joy, experiencing the fruits of our spiritual lives in a more tangible way.

Shannon will be commissioned for this ministry on December 10th.

The October 23, 2017 Vestry meeting of Emmanuel Episcopal Church was called to order at 5:30, beginning with a prayer.

The minutes of the September 18, 2017 Vestry meeting were unanimously approved.

Rector's Report

- Overall attendance for September: Sunday/Saturday
 118; Wednesdays - 11; Brookdale - 8; Oakmont - 11
- Daughters of the King chapter is up and running at Emmanuel. Linda Rector is managing the prayer lists and the group is taking on the ministry of Welcome Bags for first time visitors to Emmanuel.
- The Diocesan assessment (Voluntary Proportional Giving) for 2018 was distributed.
- The annual meeting will be held on Sunday, November 12, 2017 between the 8:00 and 10:30 services. Bagels and fruit will be provided.
- A service technician evaluated the oven and reported it was in good working order. His

advice was not to replace it but to allow more time for the oven to pre-heat. The cost of the call was \$90.00. We have an estimate for a replacement at \$4,200. The vestry agreed not to replace the stove and to advise cooks to allow more time for pre-heating.

- The Soup Kitchen has been covered by Emmanuel for the month of October. Thank you to everyone who has worked this ministry.
- A spaghetti dinner is being planned for Thursday, November 16, 2017. Spike Tickle and Mike Riley will do the cooking and donations will be accepted for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

Senior Warden Report

 In her absence, Fr. Joe reported that Sharon Kyser and Fred Knickerbocker have begun preparations for the annual Christmas dinner.

Junior Warden Report (reported by Fr. Joe)

- We are still waiting on an estimate to build the closet for vestments. Hopefully we will have it this week.
- New handles have been installed on the bell tower doors, and the new thermostats have been installed.

Treasurer's Report

 Greg gave us a draft of the 2018 budget compared to the last three years. This is still a work in progress. There will be a called Finance meeting to finalize the budget before the annual meeting.

New Business

- Tom Hairston asked about the timing of sending the pledge letter. In the past it has been passed out at the annual meeting. Anyone not in attendance would then receive it in the mail the following week. It was decided that this would be the most efficient way to do it.
