### **From the Rector**

Lent began with a cold and snowy Ash Wednesday! Nonetheless, a good number of you were present for the imposition of ashes. I am grateful to all who were able to attend and thankful no one was hurt on icy streets and sidewalks. The first Sunday in Lent, we welcomed Jamie Nealy as a candidate for Baptism. The entire congregation heartily agreed to support and encourage Jamie as he joins us in the spiritual journey toward Easter and new life in Christ.

On Wednesdays during Lent we will continue our Lenten program. We are asking you to bring a simple dish, sandwiches, etc. to share before a program designed to give participants an opportunity to reflect, share, listen and pray together and privately. Last Wednesday we considered the word *Creed* before ending our time together praying Compline.

It is unfortunate there are not more opportunities to pray together the daily offices that make up so much of the Book of Common Prayer. It was good to pray together Wednesday here at Emmanuel one of my favorite prayers for the close of day: *Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. Amen.*

Whether alone or in a group, we can pray the common prayers of the Church. Compline begins on page 127 of the Book of Common Prayer. The prayer above is on page 134. Compline and the other daily offices can also be found on line at [bcponline.org](http://bcponline.org).

Join us this Wednesday and every Wednesday during Lent. We begin at six with the meal and are done no later than seven fifteen.

See you Sunday if not before.
